




**Children Did Not See Doctor**



**Children Visiting the Dentist in 2013**





**GOAL: ENSURE THE OVERALL HEALTH OF ALL AT-RISK CHILDREN**

**STRATEGIES:**

1. Increase access for all at-risk children to mental health services where children and families are most comfortable, including in schools.
2. Increase access to comprehensive MH prevention services
3. Increase early assessment of MH and developmental disorders to ensure early treatment.
4. Increase access, coverage and utilization of primary care physicians.
5. Increase participation in school nutrition programs, including summer food programs.
6. Increase the percentage of children receiving dental care.

**GOAL: ENSURE THE OVERALL HEALTH OF PARENTS TO ENSURE PROPER CARE OF THEIR CHILDREN.**


1. Increase access to appropriate mental health services.
2. Increase knowledge of proper nutrition.
3. Increase access, coverage and utilization of primary care providers.
4. Establish local prevention coalitions in communities with high IGP
5. Increase access to treatment for MH and substance abuse.



**RECOMMENDATIONS FROM IGP REPORT:**


1. Ensure the nutritional needs of children living in intergenerational poverty are met both in the home and in the school to support healthy development and academic success
2. Ensure parents and children have access to and receive mental health care.
3. Increase awareness among intergenerational poverty families of the importance of good oral health, especially those with children five years old and younger.
4. Ensure young children are on the path to healthy development.

### Childhood Abuse and Neglect

- 28% of adults in IGP cohort were victims of abuse or neglect
- 34% of the IGP adults were treated for substance abuse in 2013
- 38% of the IGP adults who were victims as children were perpetrators
- 25% of the IGP adults, regardless of whether abused as a child, were perpetrators
- 1.5% of Utah Child population were victims of abuse or neglect in 2013
- 26% of the IGP children and 14% of the At-risk children were victims of abuse or neglect







**GOAL: ENSURE A SAFE AND NURTURING HOME ENVIRONMENT FOR AT-RISK CHILDREN**

**STRATEGIES:**

1. Increase availability of parent education programs to support health development and nurturing of infants and toddlers
2. Increase the availability of parenting education programs for IGP parents of teens
3. Increase the number of teen parents participating in parenting classes or workshops
4. Increase availability of home visitation programs for new and expectant families in the IGP Cohort
5. Increase availability and participation among IGP parents in evidence-based home visiting programs
6. All state agencies adopt the Strengthening Families Framework.
7. Increase participation among at-risk kids in evidence-based reading programs
8. Ensure access to quality care for infants and toddlers

**RECOMMENDATIONS FROM IGP REPORT:**

1. Support new parents.
2. Prioritize placement of young children in high quality, safe and developmentally appropriate settings.
